Most nonprofit boards elect members to four officer positions, including board chair, vice-chair, secretary and treasurer. The roles, terms and job descriptions should be outlined clearly in the organization's bylaws or by board policy.

All charitable boards and their members have to understand that in addition to federal and state law, there is an added burden by serving on the board of directors of a nonprofit. Nonprofits are designated as such under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Service Code.

Board members often have full time jobs, families, busy professional lives but are also tasked with legal obligations as fiduciaries to ensure that the nonprofit's assets serve the nonprofit's mission and benefit the public - not private interests.

The Board of Directors is the governing body of a nonprofit. Individuals who sit on the board are responsible for overseeing the organization's activities. Board members meet periodically to discuss and vote on the affairs of the organization. At a minimum, an annual meeting must occur with all board members present.

**A Nonprofit's Board of Directors - What is a Board?**  
The board is responsible for making sure that the nonprofit operates with the laws that govern it at the local, state, and national level. That can mean things like submitting annual corporate paperwork to the state, submitting revenue/tax information to appropriate agencies (in the US it's the IRS), and renewing solicitation permits.

Nonprofit governance has a dual focus: achieving the organization's social mission and the ensuring the organization is viable. Both responsibilities relate to fiduciary responsibility that a board of trustees (sometimes called directors, or Board, or Management Committee—the terms are interchangeable) has with respect to the exercise of authority over the explicit actions the organization takes.
